Key Vocabulary	
Promises	A statement or agreement to do something
Symbols	An object that represents something else
Sacrament	The sacraments are seven meeting points where we can come closer to God.
Commitment	To stick to doing something.
Faith	A belief in God.
Ceremonies	A series of acts done in a certain way for a special occasion.
Chrism	A special oil that shows how important you are to God; only priests, kings and prophets were anointed with chrism.
Church	The word 'Church' comes from the Greek word Kyriakon which means 'something belonging to the Lord.'
Anointing	To make holy by applying oil.
Trinity	There is only one God – one God in three persons (Father, Son and Holy Spirit). We call this mystery the Trinity.
