## What I should know already

Lent, a time of giving in preparation for the celebration of the sacrifice of Jesus

Key Vocabulary	
Ash Wednesday	Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. People go to church and the priest makes a cross with ashes on each persons forehead.
Lent	Lent is the 40 day season to prepare for Easter. In Lent we GIVE (charity), we ACT (eg fasting, make changes), we PRAY. The colour of the season is purple
Holy Week	Holy Week is the most important week in the Church's Year. It starts with Palm Sunday. Through Holy Week we remember when we remember The Last Supper, the Passion and Death of Jesus, and his Resurrection.
Easter Triduum	The last three days of Holy Week are called the Easter Triduum. A Triduum is a three day time of prayer and celebration, remembering the three days that Jesus spent in the tomb. These three days come before Easter Sunday: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday.
Easter Vigil	Easter begins on Holy Saturday night with a special vigil. 'To keep vigil' means 'to keep watch' during the night.
Paschal	Relating to Easter – we have the Paschal candle
Other vocabulary	Loss, death, change, growth, Resurrection
