Holy Week

Key Scripture
Mark 10:45

'For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many.'

Big Questions
Why are some people so generous in their giving?
Why do we need to make sacrifices in our daily lives?

Key Vocabulary

Temptation	To want to do something.
Betrayal	To let someone down or turn against them
Self-sacrifice	To give up your own interests or wishes to help others/ help a cause.
Holy Week	Holy Week is the most important week in the Church's Year. It starts with Palm Sunday. Through Holy Week we remember when we remember The Last Supper, the Passion and Death of Jesus, and his Resurrection.
Maundy Thursday	The day we remember Jesus' last supper, washing the feet and his new commandment: 'love one another, as I have loved you.'
Gethsemane	The Garden where Jesus went to pray before he was arrested.
Altar of repose	A special place in church where people keep watch over the Blessed Sacrament after the Mass of the Lord's supper on Maundy Thursday
Easter vigil	Easter begins on Holy Saturday night with a special vigil. 'To keep vigil' means 'to keep watch' during the night.
Other vocabulary	Giving, carer, cost, love, crucifixion, resurrection
